

Understanding training

WHO CAN PARTICIPATE - WHAT IS INVOLVED - HOW DOES IT WORK

Clients can receive financial support and assessment services (e.g. career and skills assessments) to access training. Training can last a few days or extend to a much longer time-frame.



WE DELIVER THE EMPLOYMENT PROGRAM OF BC AND WORK WITH JOB SEEKERS AND EMPLOYERS TO HELP MEET LOCAL LABOUR MARKET NEEDS.

WHEN CLIENTS CANNOT FIND SUSTAINABLE EMPLOYMENT, WE ASSIST THEM THROUGH A VARIETY OF SERVICES, INCLUDING ACCESSING TRAINING TO HELP BUILD THEIR SKILLS.



WHO CAN PARTICIPATE

Eligible job seekers are Case Managed clients of a WorkBC Employment Services Centre. To access training through the Employment Program of BC, other than STOC, eligible job seekers must have Employment Insurance Active or Reachback status, a disability, or are a BCEA client (with appropriate designation). STOC training is available to clients with or without a confirmed job offer.

developing a skilled workforce

OCCUPATIONAL SKILLS

Training normally does not exceed one year in length and the program of study is pre-approved as it must offer a strong likelihood of employment.

STOC

Stands for short-term orientation and certificate courses, which normally are one to three days in length and meet minimum requirements for an occupation/industry.

BASIC & ESSENTIAL SKILLS

Can be supported as stand-alone courses, combined or delivered with other forms of training. This can include essential skills in reading, writing, numeracy, and/or basic computer use; academic upgrading; and/or English language training.



STEP #1

Contact your local EK Employment Centre to set up an appointment to confirm basic eligibility and discuss additional eligibility criteria.

STEP #2

Successfully participate in all workshops, tasks, and assessments associated with the training you hope to complete. The only exception is if you have a confirmed job offer and need a STOC course to start.



STEP #3

Receive approval for training, which may include financial support and assistance, sign your training agreement, and reserve your training seat.



STEP #4

Start training! Provide regular updates to your Case Manager (e.g. participation) and all required receipts/copies. Upon completion resume working with us so we can help you achieve your employment goal!
